The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (Department) reviewed the information submitted on January 24, 2018 by the Department of the Army. This submittal was in reference to the further evaluation of Polynuclear Aromatic Hydrocarbons (PAH) and pesticide in soil at Parcel 53. The Department offers the following comments with regards to the completed evaluation.

PAH

The Department concurs with the Department of Army that no additional action is necessary with regards to the PAH contamination.

Pesticides

Results from the most recent soil samples show that pesticide contamination remains at parcel 53. As previously required by the Department, the pesticide contamination will need to be addressed. Delineation and remediation to residential criteria must be met to current regulations. You may utilize various methods as presented in the Department's August 2016 Historically Applied Pesticide Site Technical Guidance to meet current requirement(s).
