Dear Mr. Day:

The U.S. Army is preparing an Environmental Assessment for the implementation of the Residential Communities Initiative (RCI) program at Fort Monmouth, in northeastern Monmouth County, New Jersey. The RCI program will privatize the management, operation, and maintenance of housing and ancillary supporting facilities at Fort Monmouth. The purpose of the Environmental Assessment is to evaluate the potential effects of the implementation of the RCI program at Fort Monmouth on the natural and human environment.

Under the proposed action, Fort Monmouth would convey all existing on-post family housing units and selected ancillary supporting facilities to a private development entity to provide affordable, quality housing, through a combination of replacement of and improvement to existing housing units. The installation currently has 667 family housing units. Fort Monmouth proposes that the development entity modernize 179 units, demolish 270 units, and build 218 new units, resulting in an end-state inventory of 399 family housing units. The initial development plan would be implemented over a 10-year period beginning in 2004. The Army would grant the development entity a free 50-year lease of approximately 151 acres of land.

In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act, Endangered Species Act, and Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act, an evaluation of the potential effects (both beneficial and adverse) associated with implementing this action is required. We are requesting your input concerning any biological concerns regarding this action, such as the presence of federally listed threatened or endangered species, or critical habitat. For quick reference, the affected area can be found on the Long Branch United States Geological Service quadrangle or on the attached location map of Fort Monmouth.

I would like to thank you in advance for your cooperation with this matter. Your prompt consideration and response would be greatly appreciated. Please provide any comments on issues you feel the Army should consider in its Environmental Assessment to the RCI Office (c/o Dinker Desai, DPW Building 167, Fort Monmouth, NJ 07703). You are urged to provide input by March 5, 2004.
