The US Army prepared an environmental assessment (EA) of the proposed closure of Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, pursuant to recommendations of the 2005 Base Closure and Realignment Commission. Implementation of the proposed action is not expected to result in significant adverse environmental effects; therefore, in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act, preparation of an environmental impact statement is not required. A Notice of Availability of the EA will be published in the *Asbury Park Press* on Monday, April 27, 2009. The public review period, therefore, is from April 27 through May 27, 2009.
