Dear Ms. Range:

The Fort Monmouth (FTMM) team has reviewed the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) 31 May 2017 email commenting on the Landfill Meeting Summary Letter dated May 15, 2017. This summary letter documented the discussions of the 12 April 2017 meeting that included a site walk with representatives from the Solid Waste Permitting Bureau and the Site Remediation Bureau of the NJDEP, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers – New York District (USACE), Fort Monmouth (FTMM), Parsons, and Trinity Consultants. Responses to the NJDEP's comments are provided below in the order in which they were presented in the email.

A. FTMM-18

A1. COMMENT: It is agreed the cap will extend to the fence (basically the marsh line) along the areas of 6, 6A, 7 etc, and any waste observed beyond the fence line will be removed/consolidated within the LF soil cover.

A1. RESPONSE: Agreed.

- A2. COMMENT: No mention was made of M18TP10 (highlighted on Figure H1), immediately west of 3B; didn't we say that would be included under the cap?
- A2. RESPONSE: The cover system will either be extended over test pit M18TP10 or the material will be excavated and consolidated under the FTMM-18 soil cover to the extent that the integrity of the building and the adjacent concrete slab will not be compromised.
- A3. COMMENT: Although I've made notations on April 2017's Figure H1 regarding movement of the boundary in the north (fence line at 6, 6A, 7 etc.) based on the site visit, I

would request a revised boundary map prior to my departure so the new case manager has an accurate representation to go by, particularly as regarding the eastern portion


A3. RESPONSE: It was agreed that the landfill cap will extend to the northern fence line along the areas of 6, 6A, 7, 7A, 8, 8A, etc. Additionally, agreed upon was that the cap will extended to test pits 5A, 5B, and 5C located north of the drainage swale and the cap will not be extended over to test pits (M18TP15 through M18TP20) located on the south side of the drainage swale. A revised FTMM-18 map showing these revised landfill boundary limits is included as Attachment 1.



The Department has developed guidance for report certifications for RCRA GPRA 2020, CERCLA, and Federal Facility Sites under traditional oversight. The "Person Responsible for Conducting the Remediation Information and Certification" is required to be submitted with each report. For those sites that are required or opt to use a Licensed Site Remediation Professional (LSRP) the report must also be certified by the LSRP using the "Licensed Site Remediation Professional Information and Statement".
