Dear Mr. Farell:

Reference to your visit to Fort Monmouth on April 4, 1990, regarding three spills as reported on the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection hotline. We have visited all three sites (Hospital, Charles Wood and Pinebrook Areas).

Per your recommendation, Fort Monmouth will install three monitoring wells at Hospital and Pinebrook to monitor contamination. However, Fort Monmouth received false signal at Charles Wood gas station. The false signal occurs due to malfunction of equipments attached to the pumps located inside the tank.

Please be advise that the case # 891212 1242, related to Charles Wood gas station be closed. The passive recovery of gasoline from the ground at Main Post Gas Station is still ongoing. Fort Monmouth has recovered approximately 6,500 of the 11,000 gallons. The rate of recovery has dropped from 20 gallons per day to 8 gallons per day.

Fort Monmouth appreciated your visit and your recommendations.
